Dr. Kimelman is a retired obstetrician and gynaecologist with a long-standing career as a generalist in women's health. She completed her medical training at Stanford University School of Medicine and her residency in Obstetrics and Gynaecology at the University of Washington School of Medicine in Seattle. She became a Fellow of the American College of Obstetricians and Gynecologists (ACOG) in 1995 and practised throughout her career as a general OB/GYN, retiring at the end of 2023.

Throughout her career, Dr. Kimelman has held multiple leadership roles within ACOG, including serving as Chair of District VIII (Western United States) and Chair for the State of Washington ACOG. She currently serves on the Washington State Medical Association Wellness Committee and Chairs the District VIII Wellness Committee.

She is Co-Lead of the ACOG National Well-Being Delegation and actively contributes to national physician wellness initiatives. She also serves as a peer supporter within the ACOG National Peer Support Program and has been involved in training peer supporters at national meetings.

Dr. Kimelman remains a strong advocate for women's healthcare, physician wellness, and medical education. She holds auxiliary faculty appointments at both the University of Washington and Washington State University, where she teaches and mentors medical students.

She is the recipient of a national award for her leadership in organising the annual University of Washington Residents' Legislative Day in Olympia, Washington, and continues to contribute to advocacy and education efforts in women's health and healthcare system wellbeing.
