Lorena Wade, MBA, NBC-HWC

Lorena Wade is a faith-led board-certified life coach, serial entrepreneur, speaker, and former Vice President of Operations for a national behavioral health organization, with over 15 years of progressive healthcare leadership experience. She has led multi-state, multi-site outpatient divisions, overseen a workforce of more than 400, managed a \$75 million P&L, and supported care delivery for close to 90,000 patients. Today, Lorena is the founder of Steward Path, where she supports women navigating growth, transition, leadership, and entrepreneurship with greater clarity, confidence, and self-trust. Through coaching, speaking engagements, and leadership development workshops, she curates meaningful experiences that challenge, empower, and equip women to lead with greater clarity, conviction, and confidence. She is also the founder and principal consultant of LW Advisory Group, a healthcare advisory firm where she partners with healthcare organizations, federal contractors, private equity/investment firms, and global advisory networks on strategy, leadership, operations, innovation, and transformation. In addition, Lorena is the founder of La Doctora Collective, a platform and community she is building to elevate, connect, and support Latina women pursuing doctoral journeys and those who have already earned them. Through this work, she is creating space to foster visibility, voice, and connection, while highlighting the brilliance, depth, and impact of Latina doctoral women across disciplines. Lorena holds an MBA, Women's Entrepreneurship certification, PMP certification, Lean Six Sigma certification, and Six Sigma Green Belt certification, and is currently pursuing her doctorate in business as a two-time Pepperdine alum. Her research explores leadership frameworks that strengthen workforce sustainability and improve access to care for neurodiverse pediatric populations. This work is deeply personal, woven together from her professional experience as a healthcare executive and her lived experience as the mother of two brilliant and beautiful neurodivergent toddler girls navigating the early intervention system. Through this research, Lorena hopes to bring greater visibility to the human cost of clinician burnout, moral injury, and turnover, not only for the providers carrying the weight of the work, but also for the children waiting for diagnosis, therapy, and life-changing support. Her hope is that this work contributes to systems-level change that better sustains the workforce, protects the dignity of care, and helps ensure that children and families receive the support they need when it matters most. Lorena also serves across several mission-aligned boards and committees, including as an ambassador for the Dr. Lorna Breen Heroes' Foundation, a board member of the Graziadio Women's Business Association, and a committee member of the Prospanica National Latina MBA Committee. Her leadership and service have been recognized by the U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs, County of Los Angeles, and City of Los Angeles.
